ABOUT SWIFT:

SWIFT aims to determine if symptom monitoring with feedback to nephrologists, nurses and patients improves health-related quality of life and cause-specific mortality, and if electronic capture of patient reported outcomes within a clinical quality registry is cost-effective.

UPDATES:

SWIFT commenced in New South Wales at Lismore Base Hospital and Gosford Hospital. 157 patients have been enrolled in the trial. Queensland sites to follow shortly. We also hope to have our New Zealand sites on board by the end of the year.


