Patient Reported Outcomes Measures (PROMs)

- Patient-reported outcome measures (PROMs) are a method to better understand outcomes that matter to patients
- Include any metric assessing health, illness or health care benefits from the patient's perspective; usually a questionnaire, such as a quality of life or symptom questionnaire
- PROMs are used for several different purposes including informing patient care, promoting patient engagement in treatment, benchmarking, audit and quality assurance
- Patient reported experience measures (PREMs), include satisfaction with care





Aims

To understand current practices for measurement of PROMs in renal care in Australian and New Zealand renal units

To gauge interest in an ANZDATA Registry PROMs trial





Methods

- Unit survey developed by ANZDATA PROMs working group
 - Define scope and purpose
 - Consultation with UKRR, Canadian RR, National and State PROMs registry initiatives (e.g. NZ, SA, VIC, NSW)
- V1.8 emailed to Heads of Units and cc'ed to ANZDATA unit contacts
- 2 week data collection period, then telephone follow up (June - August 2017)

























Does your renal unit collect any PROMs or PREMs for specific groups with kidney disease as a part of *routine* clinical practice?




What is the main purpose for collecting PROMs?








Which questionnaires or measures does your renal unit use?




If not collected, what was the main reason?



Proportion of units


Primary reason

Proportion of each frequency category


How were PROMs collected?









Who assists PROMs data collection?








Is PROMs data audited by hospital/network?






Action taken based on PROMs

Survey - Main points

- 53 of 77 (69%) of units routinely collect some form of PROMs/PREMs
- Units not collecting PROMs cited insufficient time / resources
- Of those collecting, IPOS-Renal (symptom checklist), mostly used for patients receiving Conservative care, and used to inform clinical practice
- There is strong interest in an ANZDATA PROMs trial





Next steps

- Working Group will consider all quantitative and qualitative data from the surveys
- Determine whether PROMs could be used for QA/benchmarking, or to inform clinical care
- Registry-based trial (SWIFT)
- Apply for funding to support PROMs project manager, database extension, data collection methods
