SWIFT aims to see if people who are managed with hemodialysis for kidney failure can benefit from more regular monitoring of their symptoms (like tiredness, itching, pain) and if feedback of these symptoms to their nurses and kidney doctors improves patients' overall quality of life. This trial is run by the University of Sydney in collaboration with ANZDATA.

The median number of troublesome symptoms experienced by people with advanced CKD is 5, with 75% of people having at least 3 symptoms and 1 in 4 experiencing 8 or more. (Moore C, et al.
